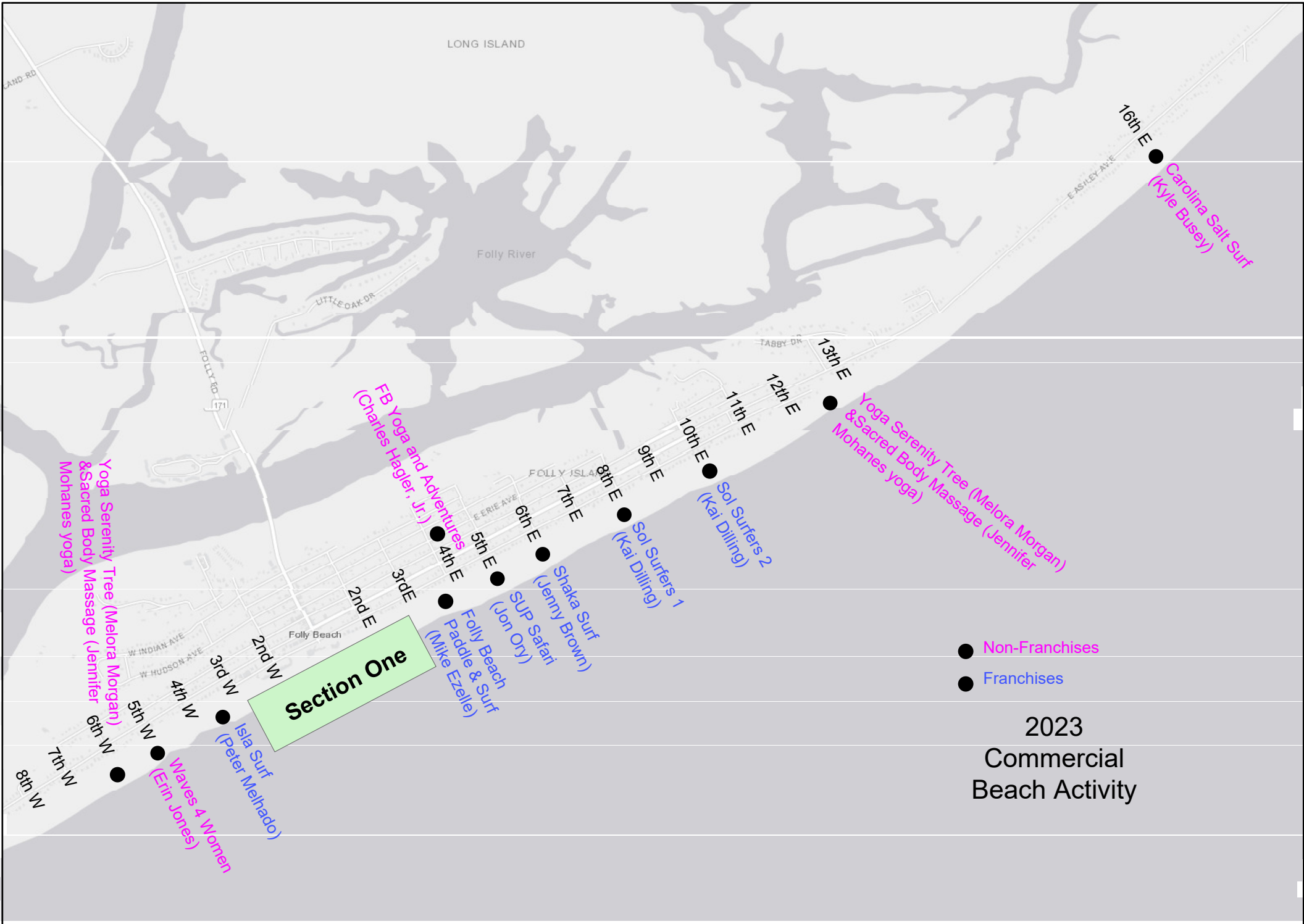

Re: Living Shorelines Pilot Project Funding.

Mayor and Council,

In 2021, DHEC developed regulations for natural shoreline stabilization and authorized a permitting process for living shorelines. As you learned last month, Weston and Sampson provided the city with a plan to install a living shoreline at Folly River Park, with four different examples of living shorelines. In addition to protecting Folly River Park from sea level rise, this project would include a community outreach component to educate homeowners on the benefits of living shorelines and a guide to walk homeowners through the new permitting process.

The estimate for the entire project is \$65,000. The project would include:

- Conceptual Drawings
- Engineered Drawing
- Permitting (Includes Fees)
- Community-led installation, Community Engagement, & Community Handbook
- Site Analysis & Project Management
- Sub-award (Includes Materials, Staging, Installation Logistics, & Team Install)

The sub-award for installation is \$23,000. For comparison, the installation of a bulkhead of the same size in the same location would be \$21,500.

Staff is asking that council approve transferring \$65,000 from the Capital Acquisition Fund for this project.

Re: Business License Class Schedule Update

Mayor and Council,

Please see below for MASC provided information related to Ordinance 20-23.

South Carolina's Act 176, the Business License Standardization Act, requires every municipality and county government with a business license tax to update its business licensing class schedule every odd-numbered year to go into effect the following year. As such, 2023 is a time to update your licensing practices to remain in compliance with the state law. As required by Act 176, the class schedule updates use the latest statistical data on business profitability from the IRS, which then receives approval from the SC Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office.

Your local government must adopt these by **December 31, 2023**, to address those licensing renewals that will take place for the license year running from **May 1, 2024 – April 30, 2025**. Once completed, you won't have to handle this process again until 2025.

Here are the steps your municipality needs to take to stay compliant with the law:

1. Make the text of the ordinance amendment applicable to your city or county by filling in the blanks with your city or county name.
2. Have your council pass the ordinance using two readings, which must be conducted at least six days apart.
3. Congratulations! You have an updated business license ordinance, which will be compliant with Act 176 in 2024.

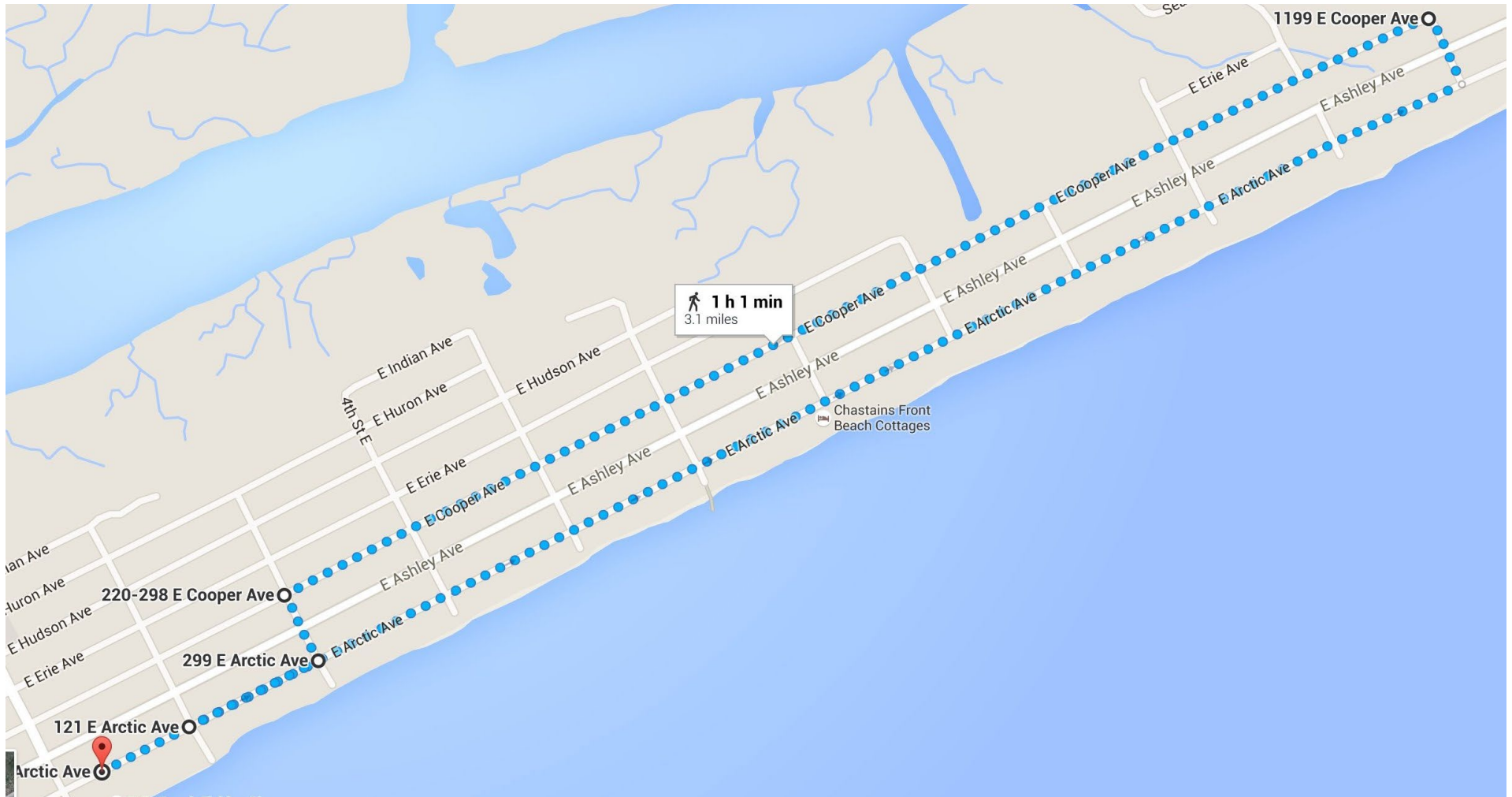

Approved Race Route

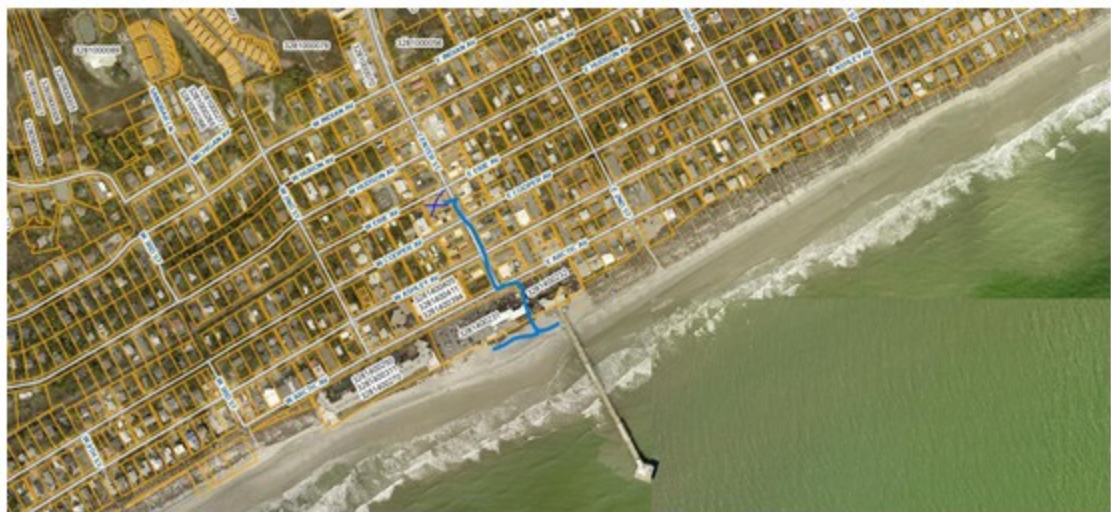

- What safety measures will be in place: First aid kit on premises; surf instructors on premises are certified in open water rescue, CPR, first aid, and lifeguarding. We have 1 instructor for every 1 to 3 students, this ratio depends on the ages and experience of the students. If under 12years of age it is 1:1

ratio, if over 12-18 years of age typically 1:2 ratio, and if over 18 it is usually a 1:3 ratio. The exception to the rule is our repeat students that are advanced and trying to increase their skills to the next level, as they are 100% coached verbally and depending on their progression we can have a 1:5 ratio.

ORDINANCE 19-23

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE FOLLY BEACH CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 72 (PARKING REGULATIONS) BY AMENDING SECTIONS 72.20 (RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMITS) AND DELETING SECTION 72.21 (SALE OF PARKING PERMITS) TO LIMIT THE AREAS WHERE RESIDENTIAL PARKING PASSES WILL BE HONORED AND ELIMINATING THE SALE OF NON-RESIDENTIAL PARKING PASSES.

The City Council of Folly Beach, South Carolina, duly assembled, hereby ordains that the Folly Beach Code of Ordinance be amended as follows:

NOTE: Deleted material struck through, new material shown in red,

§ 72.20 RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMITS.

(A) Qualified residents shall be entitled to parking decals that allow the residents' vehicles to be parked free of charge in designated paid **beach access** parking areas owned by the city. **Parking decals shall not entitle residents to free parking along rights-of-way under the jurisdiction of the South Carolina Department of Transportation.** The decals shall be used exclusively on no more than two of a resident's personal vehicles, including golf carts. Parking decals shall be affixed to the lower left corner of vehicles' windshields.

(1) To establish ownership of any vehicle for which a parking decal is applied for, a current South Carolina Department of Vehicles registration shall be required.

(2) Vehicles registered to a family member residing with the applicant may be considered personal vehicles of the applicant.

(3) Prior to the issuance of a parking permit, the applicant must pay any outstanding fines for paid parking or other traffic violations within the city that are associated with the plate number of the vehicles for which the permit is proposed.

(B) Residential parking decals shall expire on December 31 of each year.

(C) A full-time resident of the city is entitled to two residential parking decals. In no case shall more than two parking decals be issued for a residential unit. Proof of residency can be demonstrated by providing a current South Carolina Department of Vehicles registration and one of the following five items, with both registration and second proof indicating the physical address of the residence:

(1) A driver's license showing a city residential address;

- (2) A voter's registration card showing a city residential address;
 - (3) A lease agreement indicating term of lease (which must have more than 90 days remaining) and address;
 - (4) A letter from the owner of the residential unit stating that:
 - (a) The decal applicant is leasing the property for more than 90 consecutive days; or
 - (b) The applicant has permission to live in the unit and the owner expects the applicant to live there for more than 90 consecutive days.
 - (5) A current utility or tax bill (within the last 90 days of date of application, or most current year's tax bill) showing a Folly Beach residential address.
 - (D) A part-time resident who owns a residential unit that is never rented is entitled to one residential parking decal. In no case shall more than one parking decal be issued for a part-time resident's residential unit. Proof of ownership and a sworn statement by the owner of the unit that the unit is never rented shall be provided.
 - (E) Residential unit does not include a hotel or motel room, short term rooming house, or vacant lot.
 - (F) Seasonal renters and other people who cannot demonstrate that they will be living in a residential unit for more than 90 consecutive days following the date of an application for a parking decal do not qualify for residential parking decals and shall be prohibited from obtaining decals.
 - (G) The entity that issues residents' parking decals shall ensure that only one application for parking decals is approved per residential unit and shall maintain a record of the addresses of residential units that receive residents' parking decals and of the vehicles on which the decals are to be placed.
 - (H) Residential parking decals shall not be sold, bartered, loaned, or given away. A violation of this section shall result in the loss of residential parking permits for a period of one year. A second violation shall result in the permanent loss of residential parking permits.
 - (I) A lost or stolen decal may be replaced upon payment of a fee of \$10 and the submission of a sworn statement that the decal was lost or stolen. No decal may be replaced more than once in any 12-month period. This division shall not apply if the decal that is being replaced is surrendered to the parking office.

It shall be unlawful for any person to defraud, open, impair, or damage a paid parking device or related equipment.

§ ~~72.23~~4 PARKING IN DESIGNATED HANDICAPPED SPACES.

(A) It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle in a parking place clearly designated for handicapped persons unless the vehicle bears the distinguishing license plate or placard as provided in S.C. Code § 56-3-1960, as amended.

(B) It is unlawful for any person who is not handicapped or who is not transporting a handicapped person to exercise the parking privileges granted handicapped persons pursuant to S.C. Code § 56-3-1960, as amended.

(C) Any person violating the provisions of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, must be fined not less than \$500 nor more than \$1,000 or imprisoned for not more than 30 days for each offense.

§ 72.245 TIMED PARKING ON CENTER STREET.

ORDINANCE 020-23

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 110 OF THE FOLLY BEACH CODE OF ORDINANCES (STANDARDIZED BUSINESS LICENSING PROVISIONS) TO UPDATE THE BUSINESS LICENSES CLASSIFICATION TABLES AS REQUIRED BY THE BUSINESS LICENSE STANDARDIZATION ACT OF 2020.

WHEREAS, the City of Folly Beach (the “Municipality”) is authorized by S.C. Code Section 5-7-30 and Title 6, Chapter 1, Article 3 to impose a business license tax on gross income; and

WHEREAS, by Act No. 176 of 2020, known as the South Carolina Business License Tax Standardization Act and codified at S.C. Code Sections 6-1-400 to -420 (the “Standardization Act”), the South Carolina General Assembly imposed additional requirements and conditions on the administration of business license taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Standardization Act requires that by December thirty-first of every odd year, each municipality levying a business license tax must adopt, by ordinance, the latest Standardized Business License Class Schedule as recommended by the Municipal Association of South Carolina (the “Association”) and adopted by the Director of the Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office; and

WHEREAS, following the enactment of the Standardization Act, the Municipality enacted Ordinance No. 36-21 on December 14, 2021 , in order to comply with the requirements of the Standardization Act (the “Current Business License Ordinance”); and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the Municipality (the “Council”) now wishes to amend the Current Business License Ordinance to adopt the latest Standardized Business License Class Schedule, as required by the Standardization Act, and to make other minor amendments as recommended by the Association.

The City Council of Folly Beach, South Carolina, duly assembled, hereby ordains that the Folly

Beach Code of Ordinance be amended as follows:

SECTION 2. Text Amendments

§ 110.19 CLASSIFICATION AND RATES.

(A) The business license tax for each class of businesses subject to this chapter shall be computed in accordance with the current business license rate schedule. ~~designated as Appendix A to this chapter, which may be amended from time to time by the Council.~~ **Classes 1 through 8 in Appendix B to the Current Business License Ordinance adopted on December 14, 2021, the “Business License Class Schedule,” are hereby amended and restated as set forth as Appendix A.**

(B) The current business license class schedule is attached hereto as Appendix B. Hereafter, no later than December 31 of each odd year, the municipality shall adopt, by ordinance, the latest standardized business license class schedule as recommended by the Municipal Association of South Carolina and adopted by the Director of the South Carolina Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Office. Upon adoption by the municipality, the revised business license class schedule shall then be appended to this chapter as a replacement Appendix B.

(C) The classifications included in each rate class are listed with NAICS codes, by sector, sub-sector, group, or industry. The business license class schedule (Appendix B) is a tool for classification and not a limitation on businesses subject to a business license tax. The classification in the most recent version of the business license class schedule adopted by the Council that most specifically identifies the subject business shall be applied to the business. The License Official shall have the authority to make the determination of the classification most specifically applicable to a subject business.

(D) A copy of the class schedule and rate schedule shall be filed in the office of the Municipal Clerk.

§ 110.99 PENALTY.

Any person violating any provision of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of an offense and shall be subject to a fine of up to \$500 or imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or both, upon conviction. Each day of violation shall be considered a separate offense. Punishment for violation shall not relieve the offender of liability for delinquent taxes, penalties, and costs provided for in this chapter.

NON-RESIDENT RATES

Unless otherwise specifically provided, all taxes and rates shall be doubled for nonresidents and itinerants having no fixed principal place of business within the municipality.

Declining rates apply in all classes for gross income in excess of \$1,000,000, unless otherwise specifically provided for in this chapter.

CLASS 8 RATES

Each NAICS number designates a separate subclassification. The businesses in this section are treated as separate and individual subclasses due to provisions of state law, regulatory requirements, service burdens, tax equalization considerations, and other factors that are deemed sufficient to require individually determined rates. In accordance with state law, the municipality also may provide for reasonable subclassifications for rates, described by an NAICS sector,

subsector, or industry, that are based on particularized considerations as needed for economic stimulus or for the enhanced or disproportionate demands on municipal services or infrastructure.

Non-resident rates do not apply except where indicated.

8.1 NAICS 230000 - Contractors, Construction, All Types [Non-resident rates apply].

Resident rates, for contractors having a permanent place of business within the municipality:

Minimum on first \$2,000 \$50.00 PLUS

Each additional 1,000 \$1.50

Non-resident rates apply to contractors that do not have a permanent place of business within the municipality. A trailer at the construction site or structure in which the contractor temporarily resides is not a permanent place of business under this chapter.

No contractor shall be issued a business license until all state and municipal qualification examination and trade license requirements have been met. Each contractor shall post a sign in plain view on each job identifying the contractor with the job.

Sub-contractors shall be licensed on the same basis as general or prime contractors for the same job. No deductions shall be made by a general or prime contractor for value of work performed by a sub-contractor.

No contractor shall be issued a business license until all performance and indemnity bonds required by the Building Code have been filed and approved. Zoning permits must be obtained when required by the Zoning Ordinance.

Each prime contractor shall file with the License Official a list of sub-contractors furnishing labor or materials for each project.

For licenses issued on a per-job basis, the total tax for the full amount of the contract shall be paid prior to commencement of work, and shall entitle the contractor to complete the job without regard to the normal license expiration date. An amended report shall be filed for each new job, and the appropriate additional license fee per \$1,000 of the contract amount shall be paid prior to commencement of new work. Only one base tax shall be paid in a license year. Licensees holding a per-job license shall file, by each April 30 during the continuation of the construction project, a statement of compliance, including but not limited to a revised estimate of the value of the contract. If any revised estimate of the final value of such project exceeds the amount for which the business license was issued, the licensee shall be required to pay a license fee at the then-prevailing rate on the excess amount.

8.2 NAICS 482 - Railroad Companies (See S.C. Code § 12-23-210).

8.3 NAICS 517311, 517312 - Telephone Companies. NAICS 517111, 517112, 517122 - Telephone Companies.

With respect to "retail telecommunications services" as defined in S. C. Code § 58-9-2200, the municipality participates in a collections program administered by the Municipal Association of South Carolina. The municipality has approved participation in the collections program by separate ordinance (the "Telecommunications Collections Ordinance"). The rates, terms, conditions, dates, penalties, appeals process, and other details of the business license applicable to retail telecommunications services are set forth in the Telecommunications Collections Ordinance.

8.4 NAICS 5241 - Insurance Companies:

Independent agents, brokers, their employees are subject to a business license tax based on their natural class. With respect to insurers subject to license fees and taxes under Chapter 7 of Title 38 and to brokers under Chapter 45 of Title 38, the municipality participates in a collections

program administered by the Municipal Association of South Carolina. The municipality has approved participation in the collections program by separate ordinance (the "Insurers and Brokers Collections Ordinance"). The rates, terms, conditions, dates, penalties, appeals process, and other details of the business license applicable to insurers and brokers are set forth in the Insurers and Brokers Collections Ordinance.

8.51 NAICS 713120 - Amusement Machines, coin operated (except gambling).

Music machines, juke boxes, kiddie rides, video games, pin tables with levers, and other amusement machines with or without free play feature licensed by SC Department of Revenue pursuant to S.C. Code § 12-21-2720(A)(1) and (A)(2) [Type I and Type II].

For operation of all machines (not on gross income), pursuant to S.C. Code § 12-21-2746:

Per machine \$12.50 PLUS

Business license \$12.50

Distributors that sell or lease machines and are not licensed by the state as an operator pursuant to § 12-21-2728 are not subject to Subclass 8.51.

8.52 NAICS 713290 - Amusement Machines, coin operated, non-payout.

Amusement machines of the non-payout type or in-line pin game licensed by SC Department of Revenue pursuant to S.C. Code § 12-21-2720(A)(3) [Type III].

For operation of all machines (not on gross income), pursuant to S.C. Code § 12-21-2720(B):

Per machine \$180.00 PLUS

Business license \$12.50

Distributors that sell or lease machines and are not licensed by the state as an operator pursuant to § 12-21-2728 are not subject to Subclass 8.52.

8.6 NAICS 713990 – Billiard or Pool Rooms, all types.

~~(A) Pursuant to S.C. Code § 12-21-2746, license tax of \$5.00 per table measuring less than 3-1/2 feet wide and seven feet long, and \$12.50 per table longer than that; PLUS, (B) with respect to gross income from the entire business in addition to the tax authorized by state law for each table per the rate for NAICS subsector 71 in Appendix A and the class schedule in Appendix B.~~

8.6 NAICS Code Varies – Billiard or Pool Tables. A business that offers the use of billiard or pool tables shall be subject to business license taxation under its natural class for all gross income of the business excluding the gross income attributable to the billiard or pool tables. In addition, the billiard or pool tables shall require their own separate business licenses pursuant to SC Code § 12-21-2746 and shall be subject to a license tax of \$5.00 per table measuring less than 3½ feet wide and 7 feet long, and \$12.50 per table longer than that.

9.1 NAICS 454390 - Peddlers, Solicitors, Canvassers, PROHIBITED Door-to-Door Sales direct retail.

Minimum on first \$2,000 \$24.00 PLUS

Each additional 1,000 \$12.00

9.2 NAICS 711310 - Promoters.

Each additional 1,000 \$2.25

9.4 NAICS 53111 -Lessors of Residential Buildings and Dwellings (Long-Term Rentals).

Minimum on first \$2,000 \$45.00 PLUS

Each additional 1,000 \$2.75

9.5 NAICS 721199 - All Other Traveler Accommodation.

All short term residential rentals in the city shall be classified under this code.

Minimum on first \$2,000 \$245.00 PLUS

Each additional 1,000 \$2.75

WHEREAS, The City has received multiple rounds of funding from the state during this time and furthered our mission of educating lawmakers on the importance of beach preservation; and

WHEREAS, During the 2024 legislative session, our goal is to protect revenue from the State in support of our objectives.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of Folly Beach, South Carolina, that the contract with Southern Strategy Group in the amount of \$5,000 per month shall be renewed for the period of October 2022 through October 2024.

RESOLUTION 47-23 A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT THE REVISED CHARLESTON REGIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN BY THE CITY OF FOLLY BEACH PENDING FEMA APPROVAL.

WHEREAS The County of Charleston has experienced the effects of natural and man-made hazard events; and

WHEREAS The Charleston County City Council approved the formation of the Charleston Regional Hazard Mitigation Project Committee that has prepared a recommended *Charleston Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan*; and

WHEREAS The recommended *Charleston Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan* has been widely circulated for review by residents / business organizations / professional organizations of the unincorporated and incorporated areas of Charleston County, state, federal, regional, and local government agencies and has been supported by those viewers; and

WHEREAS The City of Folly Beach has adopted the *Charleston Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan*, most recently readopted it in 2017 and is required to adopt the amended version of this plan on a five-year cycle for the City to remain eligible for Federal programs in which Charleston County participates.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that

1. The *Charleston Regional Hazard Mitigation and Program for Public Information Plan* and all required future revisions from the South Carolina Emergency Management Division and the Federal Emergency Management Agency is hereby adopted as an official plan of the City of Folly Beach; and
2. The Charleston Regional Hazard Mitigation and Public Information Plan Committee is recognized as a continuing entity charged with reviewing, maintaining in accordance with Community Rating System, Flood Mitigation Assistance, Disaster Mitigation Act and Program for Public Information requirements, and periodically reporting on the progress

towards and revisions to the governing bodies of the participating municipalities.
